REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

for the year ended 28th February 2006

The Trustees, who are also Directors of the Charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, present their Annual Report and the Financial Statements for the year ended 28th February 2006. The Trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement Of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in October 2000 in preparing the Annual Report and Financial Statements of the Charity.

OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY AND PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The Charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee.

ISAD is a society of people (from any discipline or country) who are active in the field of affective disorders research in a caring or a professional capacity or advocacy. It is a non-profit making organisation.

The ISAD exists to promote research into the affective disorders through all relevant scientific disciplines, including genetics, neuroscience and the social and behavioural sciences. Inter-disciplinary research approaches are particularly highly valued by the society.

CURRENT ACTIVITIES

ISAD International Conference:

ISAD recently held its 3rd successful biennial conference in Lisbon, Portugal during March 2006. ISAD welcomed 300 delegates from 30 countries to the conference held at the Alfa Cornithia Hotal Lisbon for 3 days of lectures, free communications and posters.

During the course of the conference, ISAD was able to collaborate and coordinate with its Fellows to develop existing policy directions and to build on work already done to move forward with new initiatives.

Dr. Roger Pinder formally took over the Presidency of ISAD from Professor Chris Thompson during the AGM held at conference.

Recent Events:

ISAD attended the Anxiety Conference held at the Institute of Education, London, in November 2005. ISAD was able to forge many new advocacy contacts with UK based groups.

ISAD sponsored the International Workshop on new techniques for the Clinical Psychiatrist in Milan, May 11th & 12th 2006 at the San Raffaele Congress Centre.

The workshop had been developed by members of the ISAD Chronotherapeutics Committee.

Interventional techniques are evolving toward new directions, which can be usefully combined with traditional pharmacotherapeutic approaches in the common clinical settings. The clinical observation of thousands of patients treated worldwide confirmed that the chronotherapeutic treatment of mood disorders (wake therapy, once called sleep deprivation; light therapy; sleep phase advance; extended rest; dark therapy) leads to rapid and sustained improvements of depressive and manic states. Data about repeated transcranial magnetic stimulation sustain its possible role in augmenting the benefits from standard treatments.

The purpose of the workshop was to review current data about the use of new techniques in clinical psychiatry, in order to reach a consensus about their place in therapy and diagnostics.

The workshop had an audience composed by invited Italian clinical psychiatrists, but was also open and free to participants from anywhere else.

FUTURE ACTIVITIES

Around the Globe:

Chile

ISAD will hold its second regional conference in Chile in September 2006 following the successful first regional meeting in Argentina in August 2005. The IV Conferencia Internacional Trastornos del Ánimo will be held in co-operation with the University of Chile's department of Clínica Psiquiátrica Universitaria at the Hotel Marriot, Santiago de Chile. ISAD Fellow Eduardo Correa is the event coordinator.

Switzerland

The ISAD Chronotherapeutics Committee are holding a further event in cooperation with the Centre for Chronobiology, Psychiatric University Clinics Basel, on 11th September 2006.

International Symposium: Chronobiology in Psychiatry

The scientific programme provides a cutting-edge view of new treatments and new strategies for using chronotherapeutics in daily clinical practice, as well as an overview of circadian rhythm biology and sleep regulation. These themes are not only gaining importance in medical practice, they have wide ramifications for our society – from shiftwork to school times for teenagers, from improving sleep and mood in age to understanding the problems of a sleep-deficient culture. The Centre for Chronobiology has long been involved in these aspects of research and will continue to play an important role.

FUTURE ACTIVITIES Around the Globe: Switzerland

For the general public, on Sunday 10th September there will be a musical offering "A Baroque Anatomy of Melancholy" and also, a series of open lectures will provide a miniature "Science et Cité" discussion forum on aspects of chronobiology (Sunday 10.9.06). These lectures will be in German.

Registration is free, however, the number of places is limited and thus early registration is mandatory.

Germany

ISAD is sponsoring a workshop on Cognitive Behavioural Analysis System of Psychotherapy (CBASP) by Professor McCullough, Professor of Psychology & Psychiatry of Virginia Commonwealth University at the Deutsche Gesellschart fur Psychiatrie, Psychotherapie und Nervenheilkunde (DGPPN). Conference to be held in November 2006 in Berlin.

UK, Edinburgh

ISAD is holding a symposium during the 2nd Regional Meeting of the International Society for Bipolar Disorders in Edinburgh, August 2006, which will be chaired by ISAD Distinguished Fellow Professor Jan Scott.

4th Biennial Conference 2008

ISAD's 4th Biennial Conference will be held in Cape Town, South Africa in March 2006.

FINANCIAL POSITION

RESERVES POLICY

for the year ended 28th February 2006

1 Accounting Policies

a) <u>Basis of Accounting</u>

The Accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in compliance with the Statement of Recommended Practice on Charity Accounts.

b) Income

Income represents monies received from subscriptions and donations. The conference surplus is paid to the Charity by the conference organiser.

c) <u>Taxation</u>

As a registered charity, the Charity is exempt from Income and Corporation Taxes.

d) <u>Depreciation</u>

Depreciation is charged on a reducing balance basis at a rate of 25% on office furniture and equipment.

e) <u>Fundraising Costs</u>

Fundraising expenditure comprises the costs of advertising for donations and members and producing the Journal.

f) Management and Administration Expenses

Such expenditure includes all monies spent on running the Charity's office premises. This also includes staff salaries and accounting fees.
